FORMATION OF THE PARADE :

Police, Grand Marshal, Aides, Coast Artillery Band.

First Division will form right to left on Main Street, right resting on Mechanic Street, as follows :

U. S. Coast Artillery, Capt. Wilbur, U. S. A., commanding ;

C. A. C., N. G. S. M. Band ;

Provisional Regiment, C. A. C., N. G. S. M., Col. W. O. Peterson, commanding ;

Naval Reserves, Commander Dyer ;

Uniform Rank of Knights of Pythias ;

Drum Corps ;

Boy Scouts and School Brigade.

Second Division :

Westbrook City Band ;

Civic Orders. Will form on Saco Street, right resting on Main Street, from right to left, as follows :  
I. O. O. F., K. of P., American Order of Foresters, French-American Societies, and Assumption.

Third Division :

Chandler's Band ;

Includes Firemen, Executive Committee, Mayor and City Council, G. A. R., and invited guests.

Fourth Division :

Trades Procession and Floats will form on Central Street, right resting on Main Street. Position will be assigned in order of arrival.

Fifth Division :

Citizens, with or without conveyances, who wish to join in the parade will form on Depot Street.

The parade will start promptly at 10 o'clock.

The route will be as follows :—Main to Bridge, Bridge to Brown, Brown to Cumberland, Cumberland to Main, Main to Marrett, where column will countermarch. At Marrett Street, the Trades, Floats and other teams will turn to right into Berkeley Street, from Berkeley to Oak, Oak to Waltham, Waltham to Main, where they will join the main column and the line of march will be Main to Bridge, where the parade will be dismissed.

The First Division will right into Bridge Street.

The K. of P., School Brigade and Boy Scouts will be dismissed after crossing the bridge on Bridge Street.

Second Division. The Civic Societies will march to to Central Street.

Third Division will march to Mechanic Street.

Fourth Division will march to Bridge Street.

Fifth Division will march to Depot Street.

The parade will be reviewed by His Honor the Mayor and the City Council from a stand erected opposite Brackett Street, guide right. The Grand Marshal and his Aides will review the parade just west of the reviewing stand.

The First Division will move in column of squads until they arrive at the corner of Main Street and Warren Avenue, where platoon formation will be taken and march that way the rest of the parade. The guide will be right.
