## SUNDAY, JUNE 7th

## TUESDAY, JUNE 9th OUR BIRTHDAY

10.00 A. M. Grand Military, Civic and Trades Parade. The War Department has ordered the soldiers of Forts McKinley and Williams to take part in the parade. The entire Coast Artillery of twelve companies and the Naval Reserves have been invited. Westbrook City Band, Chandler's Band, American Cadet Band and the Fort Williams' Band will render music for the parade.

2.00 P. M. Dedication of "Riverbank."

In the afternoon, the Artillery will give an exhibition of war maneuvers. Ball Game, Warren Mills Team and Dana Mills Team, at Warren League Grounds. At the same time, there will be an athletic meet, the program to consist of 14 events, at the Cumberland Mills Playgrounds.

The concluding event of the celebration on Tuesday evening will consist of the grandest display of fireworks ever produced east of Massachusetts.
